Broward College has a long academic tradition in study abroad programs from as early as 1974, and would like to extend this tradition for its 50th commemorative year.

Study after study have documented that students who study abroad are more likely to persist in college and graduate on time than students who do not study abroad. There is no one thing that can add more value to a student's college experience than studying outside of the US, even if only for a week or two at a time. It also gives the students a global perspective.
