What is the purpose of this contract and why is it needed? ACSA (Association of Collegiate Schools of Architecture) Membership. As full member institution, Broward College through ACSA provides professional development and networking organization for Florida's Architecture courses for Architecture AS programs. This is an annual, institutional membership fee. Students and faculty interact with other member organizations and firms to network, intern and develop job opportunities for our graduates. Positively impacts 261 architecture students.

Small purchase for Category One (\$0.00 - \$10,000) per College Procedure A6Hx2-6.34 was used, where there are no formal or informal competitive requirements for goods and services acquired by the College at this dollar threshold. Membership dues, per the Florida Statute 119.01(3) requires that all financial, business and membership records held by the organization in relation to the individual(s) or organization(s) for whom a purchase order is being issued are to be considered public records and shall be subject to the provisions of Florida Statute 119.07.
