# Navajo Nation Higher Education Grant

# Reauthorization Diné Higher Education Grant Fund legislation 2025

Draft legislation to re-authorize the legislation for 20 years- forward funding and requesting all DC, NTU,
 ONNSFA get \$10 million each

## **Workforce Transformation Grant**

- Grant amount \$611,000 received 10/31/24
- Continuing funding includes \$425,000 -currently working on submitting proper documents

## Window Rock Land Lease

- Window Rock Center land lease w/extension- submitted & reviewed by NNGLDD
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## O&M Federal Funding & Reauthorization Diné College Act

Discussed reauthorization of a bill with \$70-75 million in funding for 10 years- cut go strategy for a successful introduction, going after unspent COVID funds, may mean less opposition.

- Draft of DC Act sent back (Oct 11) to Legislative Counsel—awaiting response
- Efforts are ongoing to secure a republican sponsor- aiming for "hill" hearing or a field hearing hosted by Diné College in Tsaile, AZ to be introduced by December 2024
- This reauthorization may not be introduced this year, this movement has a large reliance on the outcome of the elections.

# UTAH STATE LEGISLATURE 2024-25

Nov 15th- Last day for a legislator (House and Senate) to designate priority bill request number one

Nov 15th- 63, Last day for a legislator (Senate) to designate priority bill request number two

Nov 20th- Last day of interim

Nov 26th- First day a legislator-elect may file legislation after the election

Dec 1st- Last day for governmental entities to request bills without floor approval

Dec 5th- Last day for a legislator to designate priority bill request number two (House) or number three (Senate)

Dec 18th- Last day for Executive Appropriations Committee to set initial budget matters

Jan 21st- 2025 First day of the annual General Session

Jan 31st- Last day to request bills or appropriations without floor approval (by noon on the 11th day)

Feb 25<sup>th</sup>- Last day for the Legislature to present a bill to the governor, where the governor is required to act on the bill before the end of the session

Mar 7th- Last day of the annual General Session

Mar 27th- Last day the governor may sign or veto bills

May 7<sup>th</sup>- First day for a legislator to open a bill file or submit a request for appropriation for the next General Session (60 days after the Legislature adjourns its annual General Session sine die)
