A tradition in the deep south, it is believed that colorful glass bottles hung on the ends of tree limbs allowing the sunlight to shine through will distract and lure evil spirits into the bottles entrapping them and protecting the home. The howling sound of wind captured is said to be the moaning and howling of the ghosts to escape. Throughout this stunning play, this tree holds a prominent role in the life of the main character, Allie, as she navigates personal ghosts in the wake of a school shooting committed by her brother.

The CCA theatre students and creative team, under the brilliant direction of Julie Rada, Interim Chair of Visual and Performing Arts, have created a piece of theatre that is nothing short of transcendent. The captivating performances, integrative and immersive technology (playful projection design and live video feed imbedded documentary), beautifully crafted set, stunning lighting, colorful costumes, clever props and enchanting sound allow the audience to enter Allie's world to be put in touch with the human side of tragedy. Despite the difficult subject of gun violence, the play is filled with beauty moments of levity, humor, raw and human vulnerability, young love, parents love coupled with self - doubt and a level of artistry that will truly take your breath away.

Create education without barriers through transformational partnerships

- CCA's new Center for STEM, Power Mechanics and Applied Technologies building foundations are nearly complete and backfilled. Underground plumbing work has stated and will continue through next week.
- Transit Assistance Grant: The Office of Student Advocacy and the CCA Foundation have been awarded a RTD Transit Assistance Grant in the amount of \$22,440.00. This is the equivalent of 816 standard 10-ride ticket books, valued at \$27.50. This grant will continue to bridge the gap in transportation security for CCA students through the Fall 2024 semester.
- CCA Day of Service: The Division of Student Success held its spring Day of Service on April 17th. Over 60 volunteers came together to support CCA student service projects and community organizations. Volunteers participated in building CapriSun Rockets at Highline Community Elementary, compiling hygiene kits and making PB & J sandwiches at Ready to Work Aurora, making kindness kits with A Little Help, cleaning up the Highline Canal, and hosting a Community Health Fair at CCA's SIM Center.
