OTERO COLLEGE: STRATEGIC PLAN AY 22-23¹ SNAPSHOT & EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Otero showed annual improvement in the number of certificates and degrees awarded with a 7.8% increase over the previous year, exceeding the annual target of 1%. Fall-to-fall retention improved for full-time students, while decreasing for part-time students, but both populations remained below the national benchmarks used as KPM targets. The part-time retention rate fell significantly, from 55.2% last year to 38.7% in AY 22-23.

The percentage of successful transfers to 4-year institutions has fluctuated over the last three years, this year with an annual increase of 5.8 percentage points compared to last year's decrease while there was an increase in the year prior. Otero was down percentage-wise in regard to credits earned by concurrent enrollment students, but showed a substantial increase of 420% in credentials awarded to concurrent enrollment students (from 5 in AY22 to 26 in AY23). This was the largest percentage increase in this category among any other college in the system. However, transfers of concurrent enrollment students to CCCS showed a 6.3 percentage point decline, year-over-year.

The three equity groups had significantly lower success rates in passing and completing gateway English and Math courses relative to the overall averages. The overall percentage of students experiencing a precipitous decline in GPA from first to second semester was 9.9% at OC, which compares to 3.7% for CCCS overall. Students of color and first generation students were more likely than this to experience a GPA decline. For gateway course completions in first year, some equity gaps widened in AY 22-23, as seen through the student of color population. For instance, students of color completed gateway English at a 6.8% lower rate, while they exceeded the overall rate in the year prior by nearly 4%. Students of color also had a transfer rate (33.1%) that was on par with that of the overall Otero population (33.3%).
