Transform the student experience.



Students have worked on a variety of projects this year in the IDEA Lab at Red Rocks. During the Spring 2023 semester, some IDEA Lab students partnered with the Vertical Skills Academy, a middle school that specializes in teaching students with dyslexia. RRCC students visited the Vertical Skills Academy and led a coding and modeling activity to create a game similar to sharks and minnows through a program called Starlogo Nova. Within the activity, IDEA Lab students taught skills related to coding as

well as content-specific topics like predator-prey relationships and the effects of these populations interacting with each other.

Currently, students are working in the IDEA Lab on projects for upcoming theatre shows, the Research and Design Expo, robotics teams, and our Space Grant teams. Our students have partnered with Cheryl Brodzinsky, Gale Gober, and Kelly-Jo Eldredge to create a water pump and drain system for an upcoming play, aiming to create the look of rain inside a telephone booth. Meanwhile, students have created projects to prepare for the upcoming Research and Design Expo in early

December. The RRCC robotics team is attempting to create an autonomous vehicle and prepare for the Robotics Challenge hosted by COSGC. Our Rock Sat-X team is conducting experiments on possible methods for making concrete in space, while our DemoSat team is experimenting with seeds at higher altitudes to study the effects that UV radiation exposure and growth hormones may have on plant growth back on Earth. As we approach the holiday season, our Space Grant Club is connecting with our community through toy drive donations as well.
