TRINIDAD STATE COLLEGE: STRATEGIC PLAN AY 22-23¹ SNAPSHOT & EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

In AY 22-23 TSC met the majority of KPM goals pertaining to student outcomes despite CCCS as a whole remaining below several of the same key benchmarks. Certificates & degrees awarded increased year-over-year by 2.4% compared to the goal of 1% and compared to a 2.4% drop for CCCS as a whole. TSC retention rates continued to be strong, particularly compared to the trend for community colleges nationwide as they exceeded the national average for both full-time and part-time students. While the overall full-time retention rate remained the same as last year at 63%, students of color narrowed last year's gap, improving from 55.5% to 57.0%. The transfer rate to 4-year institutions increased by 3.6 percentage points compared to the previous two years where it had decreased by more than a percentage point last year, and by 3.8 percentage points in the year before that.

Conversely, TSC continues to lag behind the 1% annual growth goal set for credits earned through concurrent enrollment, but credentials awarded to concurrent enrollment students grew by 9.1% and met the KPM threshold. Concurrent student matriculation to a CCCS college also increased by 1.6 percentage points.

As shown last year, equity groups fell at least a few percentage points behind the overall distance & hybrid courses pass rate and all-course pass rate. Gateway English completion rates among all equity groups remained higher than the overall rate. The overall percentage of students experiencing a precipitous decline in GPA from first to second semester decreased from 2.1% to 1%, though students of color increased year-over-year. First generation students, however, decreased from 3.6% to 0.8% in GPA decline. First generation students were also least likely of the equity groups to keep up with the overall transfer rate of 21.5%. The first generation transfer rate came in at 16.5% while the other two equity groups were right on par with the average.
