Conditions of the Special Use Permit Granted Under Petition No. 22-P-1598

- A. Permitted Construction Times. Construction activities shall commence no earlier than 7:00 a.m. and shall be discontinued no later than 8:00 p.m. on Monday through Saturday within \(^1\)4 mile of a non-participating residence, unless a waiver is obtained from the affected, non-participating resident.
- B. Drain Tile Survey. Petitioner is required to provide the Lee County Zoning & Planning Office with evidence of having done a drain tile survey before a building permit is issued.
- C. Drainage Tile Repair. If it is found that any subsurface drainage tile is damaged within the proposed site, such damage be repaired to the same or better condition within one month.
- D. Surface Drainage Patterns. Petitioner is required, before being issued a building permit, to provide a map of the surface water drainage patterns within the Development Area to the Lee County Zoning and Planning Office.
- E. SHPO Acceptance. Petitioner is required, before being issued a building permit, to show Lee County Zoning and Planning Office the acceptance of the Tetra Tech archaeological survey by the SHPO before a building permit is issued.
- F. Security Cameras. If the Petitioner, due to on-site criminal activity, wishes to install one or more security cameras, the Crawfords must receive written permission to do so and ensure that any such cameras be focused into the Development Area and not capture any images from nearby real estate.
- G. Manufacturers' Specifications. Petitioner is required to provide the Lee County Zoning & Planning Office with manufacturers' equipment specification for the equipment to be installed in the SESes before a building permit is issued.
- H. Fire Protection Plan. Petitioner is required to provide the Lee County Zoning & Planning Office with a suitable "Fire Protection Plan" before a building permit is issued.
- Screening. Petitioner is required to provide the Lee County Zoning & Planning Office with
 evidence, before a building permit is issued, that they have contacted the landowner(s)
 adjacent to the proposed Development on the southwest to give them their Ordinance
 screening options.
- J. Landscape Plan. Petitioner is required to provide the Lee County Zoning & Planning Office with an acceptable written "landscape plan" before the issuance of a building permit.
- K. Foundation and Design. Petitioner is required to provide the Lee County Zoning & Planning Office with a Professional Engineer's Certificate that the foundation and design of the solar panels is within professional accepted standards, prior to the issuance of a building permit.
- L. Power and Communication Lines. The power and communication lines ("Lines") running between banks of solar panels shall be buried underground except from point of interconnection to existing utility-owned, above-ground electrical wires. If the Lines are not buried, a solar cable management system, or similar technology, must be utilized. When

Lines are buried underground, the County Zoning Administrator, when or after granting a building permit, may grant variances when shallow bedrock, watercourses, or other elements of nature land scape interfere with the ability to bury Lines.

WHEREAS, the Office of the State's Attorneys Appellate Prosecutor was created to provide services to State's Attorneys in Counties containing less than 3,000,000 inhabitants; and

WHEREAS, the powers and duties of the Office of the State's Attorneys Appellate Prosecutor are defined and enumerated in the "State's Attorneys Appellate Prosecutor's Act", 725 ILCS 210/1 et seq., as amended; and

WHEREAS, the Illinois General Assembly appropriates monies for the ordinary and contingent expenses of the Office of the State's Attorneys Appellate Prosecutor, one-third from the State's Attorneys Appellate Prosecutor's County Fund and two-thirds from the General Revenue Fund, provided that such funding receives approval and support from the respective Counties eligible to apply; and

WHEREAS, the Office of the State's Attorneys Appellate Prosecutor shall administer the operation of the appellate offices so as to insure that all participating State's Attorneys continue to have final authority in preparation, filing, and arguing of all appellate briefs and any trial assistance; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Lee County Board, in regular session, this day of Associated 2022 does hereby support the continued operation of the Office of the State's Attorneys Appellate Prosecutor, and designates the Office of the State's Attorneys Appellate Prosecutor as its Agent to administer the operation of the appellate offices and process said appellate court cases for this County.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the attorneys employed by the Office of the State's Attorneys Appellate Prosecutor are hereby authorized to act as Assistant State's Attorneys on behalf of the State's Attorney of this County in the appeal of all cases when requested to do so by the State's Attorney, and with the advice and consent of the State's Attorney, prepare, file, and argue appellate briefs for those cases; and also, as may be requested by the State's Attorney, to assist in the prosecution of cases under the Illinois Controlled Substances Act, the Cannabis Control Act, the Drug Asset Forfeiture Procedure Act, and the Narcotics Profit Forfeiture Act. Such attorneys are further authorized to assist the State's Attorney in the trial and appeal of tax objections.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Office of the State's Attorneys Appellate Prosecutor will offer Continuing Legal Education training programs to the State's Attorneys and Assistant State's Attorneys.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the attorneys employed by the Office of the State's Attorneys Appellate Prosecutor may also assist the State's Attorney of this County in the discharge of the State's Attorney's duties in the prosecution and trial of other cases, and may act as Special Prosecutor if duly appointed to do so by a court having jurisdiction.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that if the Office of the State's Attorneys Appellate Prosecutor is duly appointed to act as a Special Prosecutor in this County by a court having jurisdiction, this County will provide reasonable and necessary clerical and administrative support and victim-witness coordination on an as-needed basis and will also cover all reasonable and necessary case expenses such as expert witness fees, transcripts, evidence presentation, documents, lodgings, and all other expenses directly related to the prosecution of the case.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Lee County Board hereby agrees to participate in the service program of the Office of the State's Attorneys Appellate Prosecutor, commencing December 1, 2022 and ending November 30, 2023, by hereby appropriating the sum of \$14,000.00 as consideration for the express purpose of providing a portion of the funds required for financing the operation of the Office of the State's Attorneys Appellate Prosecutor, and agrees to deliver the same to the Office of the State's Attorneys Appellate Prosecutor on request during the stated twelve month period.

BATTERY ENERGY STORAGE SYSTEMS MORATORIUM EXTENSION

WHEREAS, the existing Lee County Zoning Ordinance does not address some new renewable energy technologies such as battery energy storage system and/or battery storage power stations; and

WHEREAS, the Lee County Board (Board) desires to create an ordinance for emerging technologies such as battery energy storage system and/or battery storage power stations; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution #9-21-25, effective September 16, 2021, Lee County established the Renewable Energy Committee to review and revise, if necessary, the ordinances, resolutions, and policies related to renewable energy technologies; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution #12-21-013, dated December 21, 2021, the Board placed a moratorium on accepting zoning petitions for battery energy storage systems and/or battery storage power stations until June 1, 2022; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution #05-22-008, dated May 19, 2022, the Board extended the moratorium on battery energy storage systems and/or battery storage power stations until September 1, 2022; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution #08-22-009, dated August 25, 2022, the Board extended the moratorium on battery energy storage systems and/or battery storage power stations until November 30, 2022; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution #2022-12-_____, dated December 22, 2022, the Board restructured the former Renewable Energy Committee into the Lee County Ordinance Review Committee; and

WHEREAS, the creation of the ordinances and policies related to battery energy storage system and/or battery storage power stations is not yet completed, therefore the former Renewable Energy Committee, n/k/a the Lee County Ordinance Review Committee, is seeking another extension of the moratorium.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, effective upon passage by the Lee County Board, a moratorium on accepting zoning petitions for battery energy storage system and/or battery storage power stations is hereby extended until March 31, 2023.
