

Unemployment Insurance Legislation

SF0058 Investment of State Unemployment Insurance Trust Fund

(W.S. 27-3-209 State UI Trust Fund established in 1997 repealed in 2002, established the WDTF)

 currently - investments from the fund help pay for the training fund programs upskilling, internships, apprenticeships

In sum: This bill moves the fund into Pool A investment fund to try to get a higher return on it for those training fund programs in an effort to support Wyoming employers with a skilled workforce.

SF0059 Federal Unemployment Compensation Trust Fund - Adjustment

(27-3-201 established Unemployment Compensation fund) - this fund is invested by the US Treasury Department - investment revenue is deposited back into this same fund)

Federally required - UI trust fund in which UI benefits are paid out of - normally in top three in the country. This is the fund that business' UI taxes, or a portion of, are paid into


In sum: this bill changes up the allocation of some funds that are recouped for non charged benefit type situations and instead of simply returning all of them to the federal UI trust fund

 reallocates them to help provide services and more training dollars to improve the workforce.



What is WY Relocate?

- An initiative to grow and diversify the workforce.
- DWS Initiative in collaboration with the Wyoming Office of Tourism, Wyoming Business Council, State Parks and Recreation and Harvard Growth Lab.





Wyoming Grown

- Launched in 2015 to address projected workforce shortages in Wyoming.
- Modeled after the Choose Idaho and Dakota Roots programs.
- Utilizes the agency's state-wide network of employment specialists.





DWS WY Relocate Funding

 DWS will receive 1.7M, every 2 years, to focus on strategies and initiatives around recruitment of out of state workers. These efforts will be aimed at bringing individuals to Wyoming to live and work, as well as bringing back those who have left the state.


