PURPOSE

At its October 4, 2023 meeting, the committee reviewed a proposed outline for its FY2024 work based on potential improvements to enhance board effectiveness as identified during board training. The committee will review and refine a plan to address this work over FY2024 committee meetings.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

At its October 4, 2023 meeting, the committee reviewed a proposed outline for FY2024. The following areas were identified for focus:

- Review board and committee workplans and meeting agendas to ensure focus on priority topics.
- Review post-meeting feedback and suggest actions for continuous improvement of board meeting practices.
- Develop plan for board and trustee training opportunities.
- Review and refine new trustee orientation process.
- Review and refine governance documents.
- Review committee structure and roles.
