

Workforce Development Training Fund and Apprenticeships



Business Training Grant (BTG)

This grant is available to help businesses send their current employees to training in order to correct a skill deficiency or upgrade their skill level in their current occupation.

- Up to \$3,000 per trainee, per state fiscal year, for preferred industries
- Up to \$2,000 per trainee, per state fiscal year, for non-preferred industries
- Businesses are eligible for up to \$75,000 per state fiscal year



Internship Grant

This grant is available to Wyoming businesses who want to host internship opportunities

- Requires a mentored, structured learning experience that allows for career exploration
- Wage reimbursement up to \$18/hr supported by industry wage standards and appropriate for internship
- Grant allows for wage reimbursement up to 480 hours and allows for new employees specifically hired for the internship opportunity to participate
 - Businesses can have up to 3 internships per state fiscal year



Young Adult Internship Funding

This grant is available to Wyoming businesses who want to host internship opportunities that are specifically hiring young adults.

- Requires a mentored, structured learning experience that allows for career exploration
- DWS received Wyoming Innovative Partnership (WIP) funding to support students in internship opportunities
 - Interns must be a student during the duration of the internship
 - Interns are between the ages of 16 24 years
- DWS is working with UW to support the industry partners that are involved with the WIP initiatives and hosting internships

Pre-Hire Economic Development Training Grant

This grant is available to develop an industry specific workforce for businesses where there is a shortage of skilled workers.

• Application is completed through a partnership between a training provider, local economic development entity, local workforce center, and businesses experiencing a shortage of skilled workers



Pre-Obligation of Training Funds

A means for Wyoming Economic Development Entities (EDE) to request obligation of training funds on behalf of businesses to incentivize them moving to Wyoming, or when an existing Wyoming business is expanding its workforce.

- EDE applies, partnering with the business(es), requesting DWS to obligate funds.
- Blends Business Training Grants with Pre-Hire Economic Development Grants, based on need;
- Funds accessed through the Business Training Grants/Pre-Hire Grants after applying and being approved.



This grant is available to Wyoming Registered Apprenticeship Sponsors and Related Instruction Providers associated with the Wyoming-based Sponsor

- WDTF Apprenticeship Grant reimburses the expenses incurred in the formal related instruction component of an apprenticeship program
- There are currently 89 Registered Apprenticeship Programs in Wyoming with 44 different occupations registered under those programs



DWS WyHealthTrain Grant

The purpose of this grant is to assist Wyoming Citizens with healthcare-related training costs that will result in a degree or certification within a 2-year timeframe.

- Household income limits are at or below 300% of the federal poverty guidelines; and/or
- Have experienced unemployment /underemployment as a result of the pandemic.

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DWS WyHealthTrain Grant

- Accepting applications November 1st for those starting in the Spring of 2024
- Accepting applications Mid April for those starting in the Fall of 2024
- Assist eligible students with <u>up to</u> \$10,000 towards their educational expenses in a qualifying healthcare program
- Increase the number of students enrolled in Healthcare programs at Wyoming Community Colleges and UW
- Increase the percentage of students in the program who receive a Healthcare degree in 2 years
- Initial funding reserved for new enrollees of Healthcare programs

DWS State Apprenticeship Expansion Funding (SAEF)

The purpose of this grant is to develop and expand registered apprenticeship across Wyoming through On the Job Learning (OJL) reimbursement for each Registered Apprentice within your program.

- Employer reimbursement of the apprentices hourly wage up to \$1,000
- This federal grant was recently awarded to DWS by the Department of Labor



The purpose of this grant is to develop a pre-apprenticeship program focusing on career pathways for in-school youth (16-24 years old)

- Household income limits are below 300% of the federal poverty guidelines; and/or
- Have experienced unemployment /underemployment as a result of the pandemic.



DWS ARPA Pre-Apprenticeship Grant

- Continue the work being done to expand Registered Apprenticeship Programs with the focus of connecting youth to these opportunities
- Support the pipeline of workers by connecting high school youth with opportunities to gain post-secondary credentials while still in high school
- Provide completion award of \$1,500 per student
- Provide \$1,000 per participating student for supportive services aligned with WIOA
- A modern apprenticeship hub (website) will be developed and utilized to bridge the gap between the state, students, and employers to promote and develop pre-apprenticeships for students across the state of Wyoming
