TRANSFORM THE STUDENT EXPERIENCE

• Project Connect

Pikes Peak State College's Project Connect, launching in October, aims to address student self-perceptions and build a personal sense of empowerment by expanding their social and cultural networks. Its ultimate goal is to increase retention and graduation among its most vulnerable students.

As a federal grant designed to support primarily first-generation and low-income college students, Pikes Peak's TRIO Student Support Services provides a wide range of services to support students in reaching individual academic and career goals.

However, observation suggests that this vulnerable student population is often not fully engaged in either TRIO or larger college events. This lack of engagement results in fewer students continuing to move forward through college to graduation.

Project Connect is designed to build social capital by structuring experiences for under-represented and marginalized student populations to connect with other students and community members outside of students' typical social connections and relationships," said Carrie Riffee, TRIO Student Support Services (SSS) Project Specialist and creator of Project Connect.

The expected result of Project Connect is increased student confidence and wellbeing, the creation of mentoring relationships, and increased retention and graduation rates among participating students.

The first annual event is set for Oct 6 where students will enjoy a free lunch, connect with other students, and hear from a guest panel. The panel, members of the Black and Hispanic Chambers of Commerce, will share their experience of being first-generation college students and what drove them to become successful business people.

Colorado Springs Business Journal: New leadership center, course at PPSC Pikes Peak State College is now home to a new center for developing community leaders — one of 10 in the nation established by the nonprofit organization The Citizens Campaign.

At PPSC; the <u>Citizen Leadership Center</u>, as it's called, will "aim to give citizens the tools and know-how to exercise their power beyond the ballot," according to a Sept. 19 press release.

As part of the center, PPSC will offer a <u>free course on leadership</u> and "No-Blame Problem Solving," based on The Citizens Campaign's staple method taught to achieve government engagement and change, PPSC's release said. The course is open to all students and the public, and its materials can be accessed at any time.

PPSC also announced its political science curriculum will now incorporate the nonpartisan organization's principles, which include "service, civility and pragmatism." The college and campaign's goal is to establish a "civic trust" based at PPSC — an association of citizens trained to address community issues and work productively with public officials.

"This program seeks to educate, to promote collaboration, and to unify broader interests while seeking solutions to 21st century community issues and problems," Dr. Elsa Dias, a PPSC political science faculty member, said in the release.
