TOPIC: Board Policy 16-40, Architectural Design

RELATIONSHIP TO THE STRATEGIC PLAN: Redefine our value proposition through accessibility, affordability, quality, accountability, resource development, and operational excellence.

EXPLANATION:

As part of the effort by Legal Affairs to review and update all policies and procedures over a five year period of time, BP 16-40 was reviewed. BP 16-40 outlines a review process for capital projects that will have a visual impact or will affect the nature of campus design. The current policy specifies that the System President/Chancellor shall determine when a project falls within the scope of this BP and describes potential review processes/committees appointed by the Board Chair to review architectural plans and approve renderings.

In the last 15 years, the System President/Chancellor has never determined a project fell under the scope of the policy and put the review process described in BP 16-40 in place. Moreover, since the time of the last adoption of this BP in 2001, the Office of the State Architect has promulgated standardized and rigorous processes and procedures to assure highly qualified architects are designing capital construction projects on behalf of our colleges. All of our colleges are required to follow these processes. As a result, the language in BP 16-40 is no longer necessary and staff is recommending the Board repeal BP 16-40 in its entirety.

RECOMMENDATION: CCCS Staff recommends the Board repeal BP 16-40.
