RE:	Resolution 23-27 – A Resolution Authorizing an Exception to the Competitive Bidding and/or Pricing Quotes for the City of Saint Paul to Purchase a Burn Cage

SUMMARY: Resolution 23-27 approves an exception to the competitive bidding and/or pricing quotes for the City of Saint Paul to purchase a burn cage.

PREVIOUS COUNCIL ACTION: None.

BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION: The City has received a grant from the US Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), Grant Number 02J44501 for the Aalax Landfill Development Project, which is to develop a new landfill at the Aalax site near Polovina Hill, which will include new landfill cells, fencing, signage, equipment building, access road and purchase of equipment for solid waste management including new burn boxes, heavy equipment, and drop boxes.

The City administration reached burn boxes that are commercially available. In Alaska the burn cages produced by SCS Alaska and the Tox burner are the only burn boxes available for purchase. The Tox Burner is too small for our refuse volume, leaving the larger burn cages produced by SCS Alaska as the only alternative for burn box. SCS Alaska is the authorized manufacture and dealer in Alaska for these types of burn cages.
