Work plans – Priority areas:

- RAIB aims to assist with researching and identifying financing, funding, grants, and partnering opportunities focused on increasing resiliency through diversifying the Saint Paul economy
- RAIB remains committed to assessing the Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy (CEDS) and providing guidance on infrastructure, economic development, and workforce development. This assistance will aid in identifying and prioritizing actionable initiatives to ensure the stability of St. Paul in the short term, particularly in areas such as fisheries, transportation, tourism, and port implementation.

WHAT DOES SUCCESS LOOK LIKE?

- Helping Saint Paul resolve the various air travel challenges, like ASOS outages
 - Identifying funding opportunities to support system upgrades identified from subaward research
 - Engaging with federal partners to receive aid and support for system improvements
 - Subaward deliverable of system needs and associated costs, along with localized economic impact from system outages.
- Successful submission for additional competative grant opportunities
- Identifying funding streams to support grant match requirements, beyond reliance on current taxes
- Increasing staff capacity and expertise through trainings and resources
