PURPOSE

Board Policy 1A.1 Minnesota State Colleges and Universities Organization and Administration, Part 6. Board Policies and System Procedures requires board review and approval of proposed board policy changes and that each board policy is reviewed at least once every five years.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The proposed amendment consists mostly of technical edits, and the application of new formatting and writing standards. The 30-day comment period concludes on October 16, 2024. Stakeholder comments received to date ask for clarity related to the relevance of this policy for college and university affiliated foundations. These comments will be considered in partnership with the System Director for Foundation Services Jen Dobossy prior to the second reading in November where we will ask for approval of the proposed amendment.

1 5.15 Fundraising

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Part 1. Policy Statement.

- 4 It is the policy of the Board of Trustees that any c Colleges, universitiesy, and the system office
- 5 <u>shall</u> conducting fund-raising and/or gambling events shall do so in accordance with the
- 6 following principles<u>- and guidelines.</u>
- 7

8 Part 2. Fundraising Principles and Guidelines.

- 9 Organizations whose primary activity is to solicit funds publicly on behalf of the Minnesota
 10 State Colleges and Universities or its institutions shall obtain the approval of the chancellor for
- 11 the system office and on the approval of the president for a college or university before using
- 12 the college's or university's name or facilities to solicit funds. If a foundation has a signed
- 13 contract in place between the foundation and the college or university it supports, no further
- 14 approval is required.

- 16 Organizations whose primary activity is not fundraising but which occasionally provide funds to
- 17 the Minnesota State Colleges and Universities are not covered by these principles guidelines
- unless their fundraising efforts involve the use of the college or university's name and facilities.
- 19 However, the Minnesota State Colleges and Universities neither endorses nor disapproves
- 20 efforts by private sector<u>external</u> groups to engage in such fundraising activities when those
- 21 activities are associated with the sale of goods and services.

- 23 The relationship of the Minnesota State Ccolleges and Uuniversities to fundraising efforts for
- 24 intercollegiate athletics <u>mustshall</u> be in <u>strict</u> compliance with applicable rules and regulations
- of any intercollegiate athletic association or conference of which the college or university is a
 member.
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28 Part 3. Gambling-

29 Except as provided in this policy, no gambling or betting, as commonly understood and/or

- 30 defined in Minnesota Statutes, Chapter Minn. Stat. Ch.Sec. 609.75-609.76 is allowed on college,
- 31 university, or system property.
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- 33 Raffles are not prohibited by this policy if:
 - a. The raffle is conducted by a college, university, or system office, or related groups; and
 - b. Prizes are donated by an individual, firm, or other organization such as foundations and auxiliary boosters; and
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- c. The raffle meets the requirements of Minnesota Statutes section Minn. Stat. § 349.166.

39 Part 4. Accountability/Reporting-

- 40 An annual accounting will be provided to the Board of Trustees <u>upon request</u> of the receipt and
- disposition of funds or gifts-in-kind contributed to the system, colleges, or universities, or
- 42 <u>system office</u> as provided for in Board Policy 7.7, Gifts and Grants Acceptance.
