Mental Health

During the first week of spring classes, a brief survey on mental health was distributed by the SGA to the RBC student body. A total of 30 students responded to the survey; 15 were commuter students and 15 were residential students. A snapshot of survey results is provided in the table below:

Do you feel safe on campus?	63% Yes 37% Somewhat
Do you know where to receive mental health care?	48.1% Yes 51.9% No
Are you satisfied with Richard Bland's mental health resources?	60% Yes 40% No
Has Covid-19 affected your stress levels on campus?	40.7% Yes 59.3% No
Are you finding it hard to concentrate? If so, elaborate if possible.	40.7% Yes 59.3% No

The majority of students who selected "yes" for difficulty in concentration also disclosed having been diagnosed with ADHD or ADD. Others say that they are still adjusting to college life.

Overall, the majority of students report feeling content with mental health resources on campus. The responses from students who need to utilize the resources identified two key areas of concern: 1) Not enough resources or counselors and 2) lack of knowledge and communication on finding mental health resources.

Student Assembly

A warm welcome was received by SGA leaders on January 19th at the William & Mary Legislative Reception in Richmond. Many of the students had wonderful things to say about those they met and are excited for this semester's opportunities and progress.

Athletics
