TRANSFORM THE STUDENT EXPERIENCE

• EQUITY & INCLUSION - ACC RECEIVES GRANT FROM LUMINA FOUNDATION

ACC has received a mini-grant from Lumina Foundation to support its <u>REACH</u> <u>Collaborative</u> initiatives (Racial Equity for Adult Credentials in Higher Ed). The REACH Collaborative is focused on creating clear paths for more Black, Hispanic and Native American adult students to grow their skills and advance their careers. Funding from ACC's mini-grant will be used for translation services for appointments, phone calls and presentations. ACC has contracted with a live translation service organization to provide real-time dialogue and support for recruiting, and retaining, Hispanic adult learners. ACC is also actively working on a plan to create a true "sense of belonging" space for new ACC adult learner students. Supported by Lumina Foundation, the REACH Collaborative established a goal for a 2% increase in credential attainment for enrolled Black, Hispanic, and Native American adults - ages 25-64 - at participating community colleges by 2023. REACH's three main components – Credentials to Degrees Pathways, Bundled and Sequenced Supports, and Culturally Sustaining Practices – are intentionally designed to work together to support adult students of color.

• STUDENT SUCCESS - LOPEZ SPEAKS AT COLORADO STATE CAPITOL

ACC student Nicole Lopez (Early Childhood Education) spoke about the benefits of <u>COSI</u> and related support services on March 7 during COSI Day at the Colorado State Capitol. COSI works to reduce barriers to postsecondary education by providing funding across the state for student programing.

GROSBOLL SELECTED FOR NREL'S CCI PROGRAM

ACC student Dani Grosboll has been selected for the <u>Community College</u> <u>Internship (CCI) program</u> through the National Renewable Energy Lab (NREL). The CCI program provides students with hands-on technical & research experience in world-class laboratory facilities under the guidance of laboratory staff scientists and engineers. Grosball, who plans to graduate from ACC (Associate of Science – General) this spring, will be stationed at <u>NREL's Cold Climate Housing Research</u> <u>Center</u> in Fairbanks, Alaska. She plans to transfer to CU Denver for her bachelor's degree in pursuit of a career in renewable energy.

CARE FORWARD COLORADO PROPELS ACC EMT STUDENT

TRANSFORM OUR OWN WORKFORCE EXPERIENCE

ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITIES / COLLABORATIVE PARTNERSHIPS

Arapahoe Community College, the Aurora - South Metro Small Business Development Center (SBDC) and the Colorado State University System are collaborating to open an SBDC satellite office at the ACC Sturm Collaboration Campus at Castle Rock. This facility will leverage diverse resources to serve small business owners and engage the next generation of entrepreneurs.

• INNOVATION – AUTO TECH AWARDED ZEV GRANT FROM CODOT

The <u>ACC Automotive Service Technology program</u> has been awarded the <u>Zero</u> <u>Emission Vehicle (ZEV) Workforce Development Grant</u> in the amount of \$80,498 from the Colorado Department of Transportation (Office of Innovative Mobility). This grant will allow ACC to acquire and utilize state-of-the-art simulation equipment for the training and upskilling of up to 40 students and/or currently employed automotive service industry technicians. Training will cover safety procedures, operations, and the diagnosis & servicing of electric vehicles.

CREATE EDUCATION WITHOUT BARRIERS THROUGH TRANSFORMATIONAL PARTNERSHIPS

• COLLABORATIVE PARTNERSHIPS - ACC AWARDED \$4.9M FROM SCC3

ACC has been awarded \$4,989,434 in the third round of the Strengthening Community Colleges Training Grants Program (SCC3; administered by the U.S. Department of Labor). The SCC Training Grants Program is a commitment to investing in education programs that connect people to quality jobs while creating a more inclusive and equitable workforce. The third round (Feb. 2023) of the SCC Training Grants Program saw the Department of Labor award \$50 million to a grand total of 15 community colleges across 14 states to expand access to education and training. Administered by the Department of Labor's Employment and Training Administration, the third round of the SCC Training Grants Program focuses on increasing educational and economic opportunities for people in underrepresented communities. ACC received the award from the Department of Labor as a consortium grantee and will partner with the Community College of Denver (CCD). Pueblo Community College (PCC), the Colorado Community College System (CCCS; governing entity for all partners), and the Education Design Lab (the Lab) on a project entitled "Year to Career Through Micro-Pathways" (Year to Career) to design and align education/training to respond to regional & state labor market needs through accelerated learning pathways. Year to Career will create six micropathways. Three will be focused within the healthcare industry and another three will be focused within the information technology industry to provide scalable, stackable credentialing in the career pathways of Health Information Technology, Behavioral Healthcare, Emergency Healthcare, Allied Health, IT Support, Cybersecurity, Cloud Computing, and Data Analytics. Year to Career will catalyze collaboration and innovation between education and industry by creating skillsfocused, market-driven, affordable learning opportunities to support learners and employers within the talent-pipeline and by initiating and sustaining system change within the participating colleges and the CCCS. The project will advance equity,

grow accelerated career pathways, create results-driven designs for curriculum and systems, and work for sustainable systems change.

• ACC FOUNDATION RECEIVES \$150K FROM ANSCHUTZ FOUNDATION

The <u>ACC Foundation</u> has received a \$150,000 award from the Anschutz Foundation for the ACC Sturm Collaboration Campus at Castle Rock *Lift the Gift* campaign. This award will be matched dollar-for-dollar by the Sturm Family Foundation and will be split between the Scholarship Endowment Fund and the Innovation Fund. Since 2020, the Anschutz Foundation has provided \$250,000 toward *Lift the Gift*, making them a top-three contributor to this effort.

UNIVERSAL PRESCHOOL COLORADO AT ACC

ACC's Child Development Center is a participating provider for the <u>Universal</u> <u>Preschool (UPK) Colorado</u> program that begins in the fall of 2023. UPK pays for children to attend a minimum of a half-day of preschool (15 hours/week; subject to provider participation and capacity) during the year prior to kindergarten eligibility. Families with at least one qualifying factor may be eligible for additional childcare.

plates. Griesheimer (13+ artist division) was awarded a \$1,000 grant from the Department of Motor Vehicles. The plates will be available for purchase beginning in August 2023. More than 300 entries were submitted, and over 30,000 votes were cast to determine the winning designs.
