
## • The "Race"




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#### Chat Bot

In mid-March, PPSC implemented a chatbot from the company Gecko Engage which is also utilized at several other CCCS colleges. The chatbot is available on the college's homepage and high traffic sub-pages across the website. The goal of implementing a chatbot is for students to easily find answers to their common questions without needing to engage with a staff or faculty member at the college. Most students prefer to find information themselves when possible, and, as the college has reduced staffing, the chatbot can be a part of the solution to providing high levels of service in the future. When students can get answers to common questions from a chatbot without needing to wait for an email response from a staff member, traveling to campus, or waiting on hold in a call queue, students receive better service and staff are able to focus their time working with students on uncommon or complex issues.
